Abstracts submitted for consideration should clearly reflect this purpose and demonstrate adherence to scholarly standards and practices. Organizational approval for performance improvement projects is required.

Type abstracts with 1-inch margins and 12-point font and limit to 3 pages. Include only the abstract title and the abstract. Do not include authors' names on the abstract. Instead, list all authors and contact information on the cover page.

Performance Improvement Abstract Guidelines

Title	Your abstract title should attract the reader and describe the performance improvement project. Titles generally should not exceed 15 words.
Purpose	Describe the specific aim (changes/improvements in care processes and patient outcomes) of this performance improvement project, its significance, and why the performance improvement project was done. Explain the particular problem that was addressed.
Background	Summarize current knowledge of the care problem addressed and organizations in which it occurs.
Setting/Population	Describe the population/sample, sample size, and setting.
Methodology/Process	Describe what you did to improve quality. Describe the intervention(s) in sufficient detail to make clear what you did. Explain the tests of change used to demonstrate the effectiveness of the intervention(s). Describe the data collected and how data were collected and analyzed.
Outcome Measures/ Results	Discuss what you found, your successes or continued needs for improvement, and changes made based on this project. Explain key findings in relation to the purpose of the performance improvement project. Mention significant project limitations.
Practice Implications	Describe what the performance improvement project findings mean for practice. Make sure that conclusions are supported by project results and relate to the purpose of the project. Explain how MONE members can integrate into practice the results of this performance improvement project. Make specific recommendations.
